- 1. Demonstration Gardens:
 - a. In front of Brodsky's bookstore: Cleaned up and irrigation redone by Richard Rubin with help from a graduate of the Master Gardener program.
 - b. Gardens at Millicent Rogers Museum were cleaned up in the spring, old plantings were inventoried, and new wildflowers planted (some purchased, others from our greenhouse). A map will be created for both gardens and signage added in 2015 to create an educational walkabout for visitors.
- 2. Greenhouse renovation: We are the only chapter that propagates and sells native plants to the community. However, our greenhouse roof was in a badly disintegrating state at the end of the 2013 growing season and the lack of controllable ventilation was causing a problem for hardening off the seedlings. President Bianca applied for a donation from NPSNM for \$1000 to cover the costs of a new roof. This was approved at the Feb. 2014 NPSNM board meeting. A report (with pictures) on the installation of the roof was published in the Jan-Mar 2015 NPSNM newsletter.
- 3. On behalf of the chapter, President Bianca applied for and received an \$850 grant from Los Jardineros, the Garden Club of Taos, to cover the cost of permanent signage in the demonstration gardens in 2015.
- 4. Seeds from 43 different species of native plants were sown, but germination was poor. Approximately 360 seeds total germinated. Sale of wildflowers netted \$450. Plants were sold directly to members on Aug. 1 and at the Taos Farmers' Market Aug. 23.
- 5. Monthly articles appeared in the *Taos News*, written by Bev Haldiman. Links to .pdf files of these will soon be found on the Taos chapter page of the NPSNM website.

- 8. A Herbarium (for the serious botanists and students) is currently housed at the County Agricultural Extension Office. Discussions will be held in 2015 as to the future of this herbarium.
- 9. Annual end-of-year social included a raffle and silent auction of items (donated by member artists) that netted \$172.

LCWP is a 35-acre nature preserve located south of Santa Fe adjacent to El Rancho de las Golondrinas in La Cienega. This rare natural cienega, or "marsh" in Spanish, hosts a bountiful diversity of plants and wildlife. The Preserve contains three distinct plant communities or zones: riparian/wetland, transitional, and dry uplands.
