On-going: The Las Cruces Chapter combined efforts with the Mesilla Valley Audubon Society and the Southwest Environmental Center in order to halt the habitat-destroying River Run event planned for October of 2020. The chapter alerted the Doña Ana County Sheriff's Office and the International Boundary and Water Commission of the proposed rally, which was to consist of trucks, jeeps, and off-road vehicles trespassing in a seven-mile drive in the partially dry river bed of the Río Grande.
